

Eagle Stadium in Ozark, Dale County listed in the Alabama Register of Landmarks and Heritage

Eagle Stadium dates to 1946 when the profession of baseball began to flourish after World War II. The stadium housed the Ozark Eagles, a D class Minor League team. Eagle Stadium was the only one of its kind to serve Alabama and Florida. Today the stadium is used for various baseball related purposes. It is home to the Carroll High Varsity and Junior Varsity teams and has hosted events for organizations such as the Alabama High School Athletic Association and the Alabama Community College Conference.

The **Alabama Register of Landmarks and Heritage** is an official listing of places worthy of preservation. The Alabama Historical Commission administers the program, which gives the public a simple way to bring recognition to historic properties. The Alabama Register officially recognizes and honors historic places that are at least 40 years old.
