

The Pleasant Hill Methodist Church in Thomasville, Clarke County listed in the Alabama Register of Landmarks and Heritage.

The history of the Pleasant Hill Methodist Church began in 1865, when the original congregation held services under a brush arbor. The church, in its current location, was founded in 1869 and served dual roles as a church and a school. The building still retains many of its late 19th century features, such as the hand hewn pews and the yellow heart pine exterior.

The **Alabama Register of Landmarks and Heritage** is an official listing of places worthy of preservation. The Alabama Historical Commission administers the program, which gives the public a simple way to bring recognition to historic properties. The Alabama Register officially recognizes and honors historic places that are at least 40 years old.
