

The Snow Rogers House in Morris, Jefferson County listed in the Alabama Register of Landmarks and Heritage

The Snow Rogers House is an excellent example of a late 19th century residence in Morris. Thomas Snow Rogers was a vital contributor to the coal industry and the Morris community. Rogers extended his home as a boarding house for the educators of Jefferson County and offered the home as an alternative classroom for ill students. The house was completed in 1898 and stayed in the family's possession for more than 70 years.

The **Alabama Register of Landmarks and Heritage** is an official listing of places worthy of preservation. The Alabama Historical Commission administers the program, which gives the public a simple way to bring recognition to historic properties. The Alabama Register officially recognizes and honors historic places that are at least 40 years old.
