

The Hubert and Ive Moore House in Gallant, Etowah County listed in the Alabama Register of Landmarks and Heritage.

The Moore House was built in 1940, serving as the home of Hubert and Ive Moore. It was also a vital venue for the community. Mr. and Mrs. Moore opened their home to a variety of important religious, scholastic, political and charitable events. The property still retains most of its original structure, including an outbuilding used for agriculture purposes.

The **Alabama Register of Landmarks and Heritage** is an official listing of places worthy of preservation. The Alabama Historical Commission administers the program, which gives the public a simple way to bring recognition to historic properties. The Alabama Register officially recognizes and honors historic places that are at least 40 years old.
