

The Town Creek Missionary Baptist Church in Union Springs, Bullock County listed in the Alabama Register of Landmarks and Heritage

The Town Creek Missionary Baptist Church is significant to the rich history of Bullock County. The founding of the church precedes the establishment of the county. Its congregation assembled in the 1830s and members consisted of both slaves and slave owners. The members acquired ownership of the land that the church was built upon through a donation from L.B. Maytag. Town Creek Missionary Baptist Church has been a vital community institution in Bullock County for over 180 years. The church has helped families through hardships and provided an example for the establishment for other congregations.

The **Alabama Register of Landmarks and Heritage** is an official listing of places worthy of preservation. The Alabama Historical Commission administers the program, which gives the public a simple way to bring recognition to historic properties. The Alabama Register officially recognizes and honors historic places that are at least 40 years old.
