## **Lincoln Mill Village Historic District in Madison County listed in the National Register**

The Lincoln Mill and Mill Village Historic District in Huntsville was listed in the National Register of Historic Places on April 26, 2010.

The Lincoln Mill Village Historic District encompasses a planned textile mill village that was constructed in a tight grid pattern so as to fit as many dwellings as possible on as little land as possible. The mill village was constructed in three phases: c. 1918 when the company was owned by Abingdon Mills; c. 1919-1924 when the Lincoln Company built most of the housing north of Oakwood Avenue along with a community center; and 1924-1928 when the Lincoln Company built worker housing south of Oakwood Avenue as well as mill facilities, a school and a commissary. The historic district contains 139 buildings. The Alabama Historical Commission administers the program in Alabama.
